City of Meriden: Extended Transfer Station Hours

The Transfer Station will be opened daily starting October 30 – December 8 for free leaves and brush disposal Monday-Friday between 7am-2pm as well as Saturday November 4, 11,18, 25. Only leaves and brush will be accepted outside of normal Transfer Station hours which are Mon 10-2, Wed 7-12, 1st and 3rd Sat 7-12.

Meriden's Bulky Waste Curbside Collection Program

The curbside collection program is now open for registration. Pick-ups will be available every Tuesday. The charge is \$40 for eight items or less. City of Meriden Leaf Collection

The Highway Division collects leaves free-of-charge for City residents starting November 6 lasting until mid-December or unless significant snow occurs before this date. Additionally, the City <u>does not</u> collect leaves in the spring. Residents do not have to make any appointments. You only have to place the leaves at curbside. Leaf collection typically occurs weekly on Monday Tuesday and Wednesday. Please note that only leaves in biodegradable bags will be collected and the use of duct tape is not permitted. 

Respiratory

Virus Season

The Connecticut Department of Public Health (DPH) conducts surveillance for COVID-19, influenza, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). These data help us to understand the trends associated with each disease as well as the combined impact of these respiratory illnesses, particularly during the fall and winter months. The most recent <u>update</u> shows an increase in COVID, flu, and RSV cases across the state. Vaccines are available for all 3 of these viruses; call your doctor or visit <u>www.vaccnes.gov</u> to locate a provider. Also, remember good handwashing and stay home if you are sick!
